

Primary Sports Funding Background

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for primary school Physical Education and School Sport. It has been given directly to head teachers to spend on improving the quality of PE and School Sport provision.

Ofsted will increase monitoring of Physical Education as a result of this increased funding. Representatives from Sport England, the Association for Physical Education and the Sport and Recreational Alliance have suggested to the Government the best way of using the funding is by schools employing a specialist PE teacher.

Our funding

Our total funding for the 2015-16 will be £8,500 (funding for previous years has been similar) this will be spent as follows to realise the aims of the funding:

- Every child will be taught by a specialist sports coach from 2020 Cricket Academy
Cost: **£10,450 per year.**
- In addition to this, we work closely alongside Caistor Grammar School and our partnership secondary and primary schools, via the Wolds School Sports Partnership, which assists us to maximize the impact of this grant. The aim is to benefit pupils, parents and school staff. **COST: £2995 per year.**

In line with funding guidelines, the role of the partnership at Kelsey Primary School will be:

- To provide an extensive range of professional development opportunities for staff; A comprehensive programme of primary school sport specific courses is organised, aimed at supporting school staff to deliver high quality PE and sport. **Additional Cost: £900 (Release time for staff to attend training) - over the following two years**
- To co-ordinate a range of inter and intra school competitions and sports events; A competition calendar has been produced, offering many inter school competition opportunities through the year. This also includes the opportunity to participate in Sainsbury's School Games qualifier rounds. **Additional Cost: £750 (Release time to allow children to be accompanied) and bus hire - per year**
- To continue to support swimming; All children will get 3 terms worth of swimming a year from year two to year six. This will support school to ensure that every pupil can swim 25 metres before the end of KS2. **Additional Cost: £2720 per year (Travel and staffing costs)**
- To ensure the expansion of school links to community sports providers; we will be providing weekly opportunities to participate and compete in school sport to enable pupils to attain high standards of performance. Through the initiative, pupils will improve fitness by keeping them physically active and engaging them in regular high-intensity vigorous activity for sustained periods of time. **The cost of this will be borne by the school - about £500 over the two years**

- To support monitoring, evaluating and evidence development; Mr Smedley (Headteacher) and Mr Evans (PE subject leader) will be supported to articulate a clear vision for PE, set high expectations of staff and pupils and provide schemes of work / monitoring and evaluation of impact.

Kelsey Primary School will also provide and run two after school sports clubs and a PE based summer school:

- Summer School: £2211
- Sports clubs: £3600
- Contributions from parents in 2014-15 covered just under 46% of this - the school contributed: £2661 (45.79%)

Total Spending planned £20,976

It is important to note we are overspending on the the grant amount we receive. The different will be supported from the schools core budget.

At Kelsey Primary School we recognise the important of regular sport and physical activity both in school time and through extracurricular activities. The additional spending reflects this commitment.

The school will monitor the impact of the Sport Premium and will collate evidence of how the school has utilized the Sport Premium Fund. Pupil feedback will be collected from each initiative, along with attendance figures for inter school sport competitions.

At Kelsey Primary School we are proud of the provision our pupils receive. We actively encourage them to participate in after school sports clubs, as well as competitions organized by local sports clubs.

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
