

Pupil Premium achievement and attainment for September 2014 to July 2015

Nursery

- There were no children in the nursery eligible for early year's pupil premium.

Reception

- There were two children eligible for pupil premium.
 - 1 reached a good level of development.
 - 1 did not reach a good level of development – but made **good progress** from a low baseline starting point.
 - Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - Scores for English: 98 and 128
 - Scores for Maths 105 and 127
 - Hence 1 child was expected and 1 child was well above expected

Year One

- There were four children eligible for pupil premium.
- Based on ongoing teacher assessment through the year all made at least **expected progress** from their baseline starting point.
- Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - Scores for English: 78, 84, 95 and 111
 - Scores for Maths: 69, 81, 96 and 97
 - It should be noted that three are on the SEN register and one is also subject to a special guardianship order.

Year Two

- There were two children eligible for pupil premium.
- Their progress from EYFS to end of KS1:
 - Pupil 1: None GLD reached level 3 in reading and writing and maths
 - Pupil 2: None GLD reached level 2a in reading and writing and maths
 - Hence both made **better than expected** progress.
- Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - English: 103 and 141
 - Maths: 91 and 141
 - Hence 1 child was expected and 1 child was well above expected

Year Three

- There were three children eligible for pupil premium.
- Based on ongoing teacher assessment through the year all made at least **expected progress** from their baseline starting point.
- Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - Scores for English: 69, 97 and 116
 - Scores for Maths: 69, 100 and 111
 - It should be noted that one of these children has very significant SEN, one is expected and the other is above expected.

Year Four

- There were four children eligible for pupil premium.
- Based on ongoing teacher assessment through the year all four made at least **expected progress** from their baseline starting point.
- Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - Scores for English: 94, 78, 74 and 78
 - Scores for Maths: 91, 79, 84 and 73
 - It should be noted that all four of these children are also on the SEN register.

Year Five

- There were three children eligible for pupil premium.
- Based on ongoing teacher assessment through the year all three made at least **expected progress** from their baseline starting point.
- Based on age standardised NFER testing conducted in July 2015 their scores were:
 - 100 is the expected score, with the expected range being 90 to 110
 - Scores for English: 74, 96 and 134
 - Scores for Maths: 79, 95 and 122
 - It should be noted that two of these children are also on the SEN register, one of these was in the expected range and the other was below, but making good progress from their baseline.

Year Six

- There was one child eligible for pupil premium, they also had significant SEN
- Their KS1 scores were P scales for reading and writing and level 1 for maths.
- Their KS2 SATS / teacher assessments were level 4b for reading, level 4 for writing and level 4c for maths.
- Hence they made 4 levels progress for reading and writing – this is well above expected progress and 3 levels progress for maths – this is above expected progress.

Overall: 19 children – of these:

- All 19 made at least expected progress. (100%)
- 13 made better than expected progress. (68%)
- None made less than expected progress from their baseline.
- NFER age related scores for reception to Y5 show 5 children (28%) to be significantly above age related expectations and another 6 to be at age related expectations (33%). The remaining 7 children 36% were below age related expectations – but were clearly making good progress from the appropriate baseline.
- These 7 children are receiving additional support in the year 2015 to 2016 to ensure they reach age related expectations as quickly as possible (or at least make better than expected progress from the appropriate baseline).
