

Pupil Premium achievement and attainment for September 2015 to July 2016 – updated September 2016

Nursery

- There were three children eligible for early years pupil premium:
 - All three pupils made better than expected progress from their externally verified baseline assessments.
 - All three pupils reached the reception ready standard by the end of nursery.

Reception

- There were five pupils eligible for the pupil premium
 - An average of 3.0 points represents expected progress, anything more than 3.0 points is better than expected progress.
 - Baselines on entry were externally verified.
 - Three of the pupils made better than expected progress (average progress of 3.47, 4.12 and 3.24 points). The other two pupils averaged 2.53 and 2.47 points progress.
 - The average point's progress of the whole cohort of 16 pupils was 3.94 points.
 - None of these pupils reached a good level of development, but their baseline starting points were well below typical.

Year One

- There were two pupils eligible for pupil premium.
 - One passed the phonics test, the other did not.
 - One pupil exceeded the end of year one expectations in all areas apart from writing where they were high expected.
 - The other pupil was working towards the expectations for end of year 1 – but was making better than expected progress from a none GLD in reception.

Year Two

- There were four pupils eligible for the pupil premium.
 - One of these retook the phonics test and passed (the other 3 had passed in year 1)
 - All of these pupils made better than expected progress from their end of reception starting points (none were a GLD)
 - One pupil reached the expected end of year 2 standard in all areas
 - One pupil reached the expected end of year 2 standard in all areas apart from maths
 - One pupil was working towards the end of year 2 standard in all areas
 - One pupil was operating below year 2 in all areas (they had reached the expected standard for end of Y1)

Year Three

- There were three pupils eligible for the pupil premium.
 - Based on externally set and marked GL assessment progress tests:
 - One pupil made higher than expected progress in both English and maths
 - One pupil made much higher than expected progress in maths and higher than expected progress in English
 - One pupil made expected progress in both English and maths

Year Four

- There were three pupils eligible for the pupil premium.
 - Based on externally set and marked GL assessment progress tests:
 - One pupil made higher than expected progress in both English and maths
 - One pupil made expected progress in English and maths
 - One pupil made expected progress in English and lower than expected progress in maths

Year Five

- There were four pupils eligible for the pupil premium.
 - Based on externally set and marked GL assessment progress tests:
 - One pupil made expected progress in both English and maths
 - Two pupils made expected progress in English and lower than expected progress in maths
 - One pupil made expected progress in English and higher than expected progress in maths

Year Six

- There were four pupils eligible for the pupil premium.
 - One made much better than expected progress in all subjects and met FFT-5 (the most challenging target).
 - One made better than expected progress, reaching standardised scores of 113 in reading, 107 in the spelling, punctuation and grammar test and 107 in maths. They met the expected standard in writing.
 - One made better than expected progress in reading and in the spelling, punctuation and grammar test where their standardised score was higher than other pupils with equivalent KS1 results. They also reached the expected standard in writing. In maths they were slightly below the standardised score for pupils with equivalent KS1 results.
 - One made better than expected progress in reading where their standardised score was higher than other pupils with equivalent KS1 results, their results in the spelling, punctuation and grammar test and maths were slightly lower than pupils with equivalent KS1 results. They did not reach the expected standard in writing.

Overall there were 28 pupils eligible for pupil premium in academic year 2015 to 2016. Of these 23 made at least expected progress in all areas and 5 made expected progress in at least some areas. 18 made better than or much better than expected progress.
